A Note from Our Pastor

There was a recent Barna Study which surveyed over 600 teenagers, asking them who influenced them the most. Like me, you might find the results surprising:

- 1. Parents
- 2. Grandparents

At a distant third was Coaches, Pastors, and Youth Pastors

Wow. I'll admit, some days this is hard to believe. Frequently, I ask myself, *are they even listening?* Well the answer is an overwhelming, "YES!" Parents and grandparents are still the greatest influence on young people. What do we do with that influence? I suggest... make disciples.

This month, I'm highlighting the significance of grandparents. You might not realize this, but even though the word "grandparent" doesn't appear in the Bible, the phrase "children's children" and "next generation" show up several times. Here are just a few examples:

Only be careful, and watch yourselves closely so that you do not forget the things your eyes have seen or let them fade from your heart as long as you live.

Teach them to your children and to your children's children. (Dt. 4:9)

We will not hide them from their descendants; we will tell the <u>next generation</u> the praiseworthy deeds of the Lord, his power, and the wonders he has done. (Psalm 78:4)

Since my youth, God, you have taught me, and to this day I declare your marvelous deeds. Even when I am old and gray, do not forsake me, my God, till I declare your power to the next generation, your mighty acts to all who are to come. (Psalm 71:17-18)



The Bible *does* talk about grandparents. When they are mentioned it is in the context of sharing a legacy of faith. **Grandparents play a crucial role in disciple-making.** As our friend Sherry Schumann puts it, "Grandparents are not supposed to only be fun-factories," but there's a biblical call to bear witness to God and shepherd the hearts of the next generation. This is one of FPC's core values: Raising the Next Generation for God.


