A Note from Our Pastor

I'd like to use this space to share a Lenten practice with you. As you know, we are in the



season of Lent. It's the 40 days leading up to Easter—a time of selfexamination, reflection, repentance, and spiritual discipline. Some followers of Jesus give things up (fasting) during Lent, others take on new practices. The goal is intentional disruption of our regular rhythms that will help us walk with Jesus and become more like him. Here, I'm sharing a prayer that has done, and is doing, that for me. It comes from an online prayer resource that I use called "Pray as You Go" (check out their podcast – it's a daily, guided prayer lasting about 10-13 minutes).

During Lent, they close each prayer with the following:

You have given all to me, to you, Lord, I return it. Everything I have is yours, do with it what you will. Give me only your love and your grace; that is enough for me.

Powerful, right? Read it again, slowly. What surrender. What a Kingdom posture. A life handed over to God. I think this prayer catches my attention all the more because of the passages in Luke that we've been studying during Sunday morning worship:

- The Parable of the Rich Fool: the danger of seeking fulfillment through material possessions
- Do Not Be Anxious: "where your treasure is, there your heart will be also"
- Be Ready and Be Responsible: "everyone to whom much was given, of him much will be required"

Some theologians call these "Absence Passages." This doesn't mean that God is absent from us. Of course not. Jesus promises he will be with us to the end of the age (Matthew 28) by the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. Rather, what they mean by "absence" is that Christ is enthroned at the right hand of the Father, and while we await his return (he IS coming back) we have responsibility over the resources he has entrusted to us. What kind of stewards will we be in his "absence"? So, you can see how this prayer lines up well with these themes from Luke. This Lenten prayer turns everything back over to God (relationships, time, possession... everything); it welcomes his will, rather than ours; and it anchors us again in all that we need—the love and grace of God.

I encourage you to add this to your daily prayer time and notice how God will disentangle you from the things of this world, freeing you for life in his kingdom. Imagine the kind of person you'll be by Easter.

Church-Wide Work Day for Outside Spring Clean-up Saturday, March 18 - 8 a.m. to 12 p.m.

Main Objectives: Cut the grass for the first time of the year, weed eat, spray round-up, broadcast fire ant prevention, prune/shape shrubs, rake leaves out of children's playground area, and spread six yards of cypress mulch under the playset in the playground area.

Things That Will Already Be On Site and Belong to the Church: church riding mower, church blower, church weed eater, church gas hedge pruners, church wheelbarrow, church spreader, church backpack sprayer, fire ant prevention, and two 5-gallon water coolers.

Things To Bring: Gas pruners, hand pruners, loppers, 6-foot ladder, side walk edger, tine rake, shovel, mower, mower trailer, weed eater and string, blower, 50:1 fuel, oil, non-ethanol fuel, spreader, gloves, dust mask, safety glasses, wheelbarrows, leaf bags, tarp, and all the young people you can find.

Larry Propst will have his front end loader tractor on site for helping with the cypress mulch in the playground area.

Don Brown is planning to cook a meal for all those who participate. Lunch should be ready around 12 p.m.
