

### The Annual Partnership - Building Cisterns

Every summer we send a team to Xpujil, Mexico to work with local churches and The Outreach Foundation to provide water in rural parts of the Yucatan. This summer, Angeline, Hannah (one of Angeline's former St. John's Christian Academy students), Cooper, and I were a part of building four cisterns. Victor, his grandsons, and the

native team down there are the pros. They are actually employed to do the work. Their model is similar to Habitat for Humanity – there are employees; then, the family that receives the cistern provides "sweat equity;" lastly, we simply volunteer alongside of them. That way, we're not taking away from local jobs down there, but we still get to be a part of it.

This is the last wall pour of the 4th cistern. We poured in 3 phases over 3 days. Foundation (day 1); first wall mold (day 2); second wall mold (day 3). Then, the pros do the top without us. Hard work, but we forged eternal friendships.



### The New Piece - Vision for an Evangelist

On Friday of the trip, Angeline and I were able to sit down with a pastor who has a vision with two others pastors to reach the more remote communities with the gospel, by sending an evangelist there to plant more churches. The cisterns have provided an opening for the gospel to be shared. So, we brainstormed over a meal how First Presbyterian could partner with them in the work. The pastor's name is Pastor Eli (Eliasar), and his wife is Eli (Elisabet). They have two boys. **Kairos moment** for me: All of us close to the same ages. They are kind of a mirror family to the Scoonovers.



Eli and Eli were great hosts. She's kind of a foodie. She cooked a stuffed gourd (ham, chicken, peppers, onions and cheese)—a real honor and kind hospitality welcome us into their home. Another Kairos moment: their hospitality and family ministry makes them kind of a mirror church to FPC.



Stay tuned for how we will be partnering with pastor Eli and "El Buen Pastor" (The Good Shepherd Presbyterian Church). God has granted the funds for us to help with this evangelism project. Please pray for Him to raise up an evangelist.



Plus, we did all the fun cultural stuff... like hiking 1300 year old Mayan ruins, playing late night soccer, basketball, and volleyball. In the love of Jesus Christ, Pastor Timothy

### **Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes**

A reminder that we will again participate in Operation Christmas Child Shoeboxes in November. This is also a very meaningful way for our children to learn how to express God's love for all the world. Listed below are some of the items they recommend. It's never too early to start thinking about this ministry and start shopping for your shoebox.

Great Gifts: jump ropes, band-aids, hair elastics or head bands for girls, marbles, harmonica, a simple watch for older kids, a solar calculator for older kids, sunglasses for older kids, socks; youngest girls, a baby doll with light brown skin and no hair, toy car, truck or airplane for young boys. (The ones with bigger wheels that are made for toddlers and are larger than Matchbox size are good. Matchbox wheels are so small, they don't work well in dirt.)

Best Gifts: soccer balls or any ball, small flashlight with batteries, soap AND a plastic soap dish that has a cover, toothbrush in a tooth brush holder, pencils, erasers, colored pencils, and sharpeners for all aged children, good quality pens for ages 10-14 in black, red, green, and blue.
