On Sunday, November 10, Larry Propst, Charles Heubach, Zach Lee, and I set out for the Asheville NC area to work with Samaritan's Purse to help clean up the devastation caused by Hurricane Helene. At 8 a.m. Monday morning we



arrived at the Cove (the headquarters for the Billy Graham Ministry). I was amazed when we walked into the auditorium for the orientation. There were at least 200 volunteers there to start working to help those

affected by the storm. Once we started out to the worksite, I was floored by the devastation. None of the

photos that we took showed the true extent of the damage.
Remarkably, I saw God in the devastation, just as I saw God in the efforts of all of those who were
