### Stewardship Through a Different Lens

Paul says in Corinthians that we are to be generous.

"Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." Il Corinthians 9:6-7



Why? Because God has been generous to us, therefore we should be generous with our finances. And we also see the concept that our generosity is an investment in God's kingdom. There's a reward for our generosity, for us AND for others.

Once a year we sharpen our pencils, and establish a budget for the church. We have salaries, operating expenses, and of course mission work to support. The pledges and donations that are provided throughout the year support all these on-going expenses.

While establishing your pledge for 2025 is important in our planning, I would like you to think about an additional way you can give back to God - service. For many years, I have thought about my time the same way I have thought about my financial income. It is a resource that God has given me, and I want to tithe my time back to Him as well. While I don't punch a time clock, thinking about giving 10% of my time back to God in His service is a helpful target for me in when I am setting priorities for how to spend my time.

Jesus told us this in Matthew, "For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also."

Where is your heart? Think about where you spend your time, and how much of your available time is spent serving God. This will look different for different people, and will change in different phases of your life. You have lots of options:

Romans 12:1 says, "Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship."
